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## **Apprenticeship Support Locally:**

### **What is a Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP)?**

An apprenticeship is workforce development in the form of training and mentorship during full-time employment.

A Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) is made up of 5 distinct pieces:

1. Paid income
2. On-the-job training
3. Classroom learning
4. Mentorship
5. Post-apprenticeship credentials

While investing in future talent is always important, registering your apprenticeship program with the Department of Labor is extremely important for the future of your apprentice. Completing a RAP and receiving credentials are instrumental in improving an apprentice's ability to find full-time employment, to grow their wages, and to transfer skills to new roles.

### **Who will your apprentice be?**

It goes without saying, your apprentice will be the person of your choosing. But here in Northwest Michigan, the pool of industry talent is growing rapidly. Both Northwestern Michigan College and the TBAISD Career-Tech Center have full classrooms with students that are a few short months from being ready for full-time employment.

Placing these students into a RAP gives you the opportunity as their employer to help them hone their skills in a way that you can tailor to your needs.

Keep in mind, approx. 95% of apprentices stay with their employer for at least 1-year after the program ends. You aren't just investing in the apprentice, you are investing in your future team.

### **What support is available to you?**

In Northwest Michigan, there is an extensive network of resources and support services for creating and maintaining apprenticeship programs.
